



Lingham Lake Dam

Dam Information and History

Originally constructed in the 1920s, this dam is situated at the outlet of Lingham Lake to the Black River. The dam is located on part of Lot 16, Concession 5 in the former Grimsthorpe Township, now the Municipality of Tweed. The Black River system is a major tributary of the Moira River.

Stop logs are replaced in the spring after the freshet. During the summer months, the water level on Lingham Lake is gradually drawn down to maintain a minimal flow in the Black River system. Stop logs are removed in the fall to prepare for spring freshet.

Dam Safety

Always exercise caution when boating, hiking or fishing near dams.

Stay off the dam structures unless the area is clearly marked for public travel.

Be alert to changes in water levels.

Read and pay attention to warning signs near dams.



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
